The Disengaged Youth Dilemma

THE CURRENT CHALLENGE

Currently, one in eight young people between the ages of 16 and 24 in the United States are <u>not working</u>, in education, nor in training. This disconnection may be symptomatic of long-term disengagement happening in our schools, where 40 to 60 percent of high school students are considered "<u>chronically disengaged</u>" from the educational experience. Factors contributing to this disengagement include <u>traditional educational practices that fail</u> to engage today's learners, <u>an inability to connect the relevance of</u> <u>what's being taught in school</u> to life outside the classroom, and classroom environments <u>where students often feel isolated from</u> <u>educators and peers</u>.

THE MISALIGNMENT

At Junior Achievement (JA), we believe these factors contribute to a misalignment between what is being taught in schools and societal needs and expectations. As a result, too many young people reach adulthood ill-prepared with essential life skills, such as work and career readiness, financial capability, and even an entrepreneurial mindset, to achieve their potential as adults. This misalignment presents itself as <u>a lack of motivation and adaptability</u>, <u>difficulties</u> with interpersonal communication, <u>unrealistic expectations</u>, and <u>the struggle for meaning and purpose in the workplace</u> that employers often ascribe to Generation Z.
