What is JA BizTown[®]?

Elementary school students are not old enough to drive, work, or vote. That doesn't stop them from operating banks, running businesses, managing checking accounts and earning a profit at JA BizTown! Our JA BizTown, located in our JA Inspiration Center, is a mini-city in which kids discover how the "real world" works. After 12 lessons are taught by the classroom teacher, students come to JA BizTown for the learning experience of their lives! The students become JA BizTown "citizens" where they work in one of 14 businesses, make financial decisions, pay taxes, and donate to charity. Each citizen has a job for the day, gets paid twice, opens a checking and savings account, shops, votes for important matters at City Hall, and much more. The time spent at JA BizTown may be only one day, but the impact this experiential learning provides will last a lifetime!



Experiential Learning

- JA BizTown[®] provides an authentic experience with its real-world simulation of a small town for fourth sixth grade students.
- In their roles of JA BizTown citizens, students learn what it is like to function in the real world, with interactive opportunities to apply classroom learning as well as use problem-solving and teamwork skills.
- When students "learn by doing," their learning experience is more memorable!



JA BizTown[®] is home to 14 different businesses, all of which provide unique needs to its citizens.

Overview of the JA BizTown Day

Student Welcome/Orientation

Overview of day, rules, emergency plan in large group

Job Training

- CMOs and CFOs go to job training with JA staff
- All other employees go to business to read through job sheets.
- Volunteer leads Staff Meeting #1

Business Start-Up

- CFO takes out loan, processes payroll and prints paychecks.
- Business supplies delivered from MetroLINK.
- Students read/review job responsibilities. CEOs prepare for speech.
- Price-setting

Opening Town Meeting

- Introduction of Mayor and his/her speech that highlights the importance of voting and pending awards
- CEOs present brief description of their business (except Vibrant CEO)
- Dismissed for CEO staff meeting

Employee Work/Break Rotations (1st break /25 min)

- All businesses open and begin work.
- Employees begin taking breaks based on their neck wallet color (red, yellow, or green)
- On break, deposit first paycheck; open Savings Account if so desired
- While on break, students shop, make a donation, play games, eat lunch
- Volunteers may eat lunch with their child

Employee Work/Break Rotations (2nd break /20 minutes)

- Second employee bank deposit will be a direct deposit; no visit to Vibrant required
- Employee breaks continue with shopping and eat lunch if didn't happen during 1st break.
- Employee work continues.

Staff Meeting and Clean-Up

- Volunteer leads last staff meeting.
- Volunteers collect and empty neck wallets and oversee business cleanup.

Closing Town Meeting

- Mayor speaks
- Awards presented; Voting results reported
- Vibrant CEO gives speech
